Date:

On December 29, 2016 at 7:00 p.m. a Storm Water Advisory Committee (SWAC) meeting was held at the Cold Spring, Kentucky, City Hall.

Attendee's: Lou Gerding, Steve Taylor, Brenda Helton, Christopher Ampfer, David Guidugl and Dave Crouch

Summary:

Introductions were done as the attendees entered the City Council Chambers.

Steve Taylor called the meeting to order at approximately 7:15 p.m.

Steve Taylor introduced Dave Crouch the City's new storm water consultant. He stated Dave is with Bayer Becker and is replacing the former consultant who retired in 2016.

Dave Crouch provided copies of the Power Point Presentation to those in attendance.

Steve Taylor discussed the meeting material stating the group in attendance is familiar with the storm water program.

Dave Crouch shared his background information with the group. Dave said he had met recently with Kentucky Division of Water Official, Abigail Rains. Lou Gerding and David Guidugl also attended the meeting in Frankfort, Kentucky. During the meeting with Abigail Rains, she indicated Cold Springs is currently in full compliance with the MS4 permit. She has no issues now.


Lou Gerding stated Abigail Rains and Dave Crouch have a similar environmental career history.

Dave Crouch stated Abigail Rains will be conducting the first inspection of the Cold Spring Storm Water Program during the spring of 2017.

Chris asked Steve Taylor if the all the required written programs were completed. Steve Taylor stated yes, they are and Dave Crouch stated he is already working on a Best Management Practices (BMP) Draft which is slated to be released in 2017.

Brenda Helton asked Steve Taylor if there would be any cost reduction as the result of having a new storm water consultant. Steve replied approximately \$40,000 annually.

No further questions were received and the meeting ended at approximately 7:45 p.m.

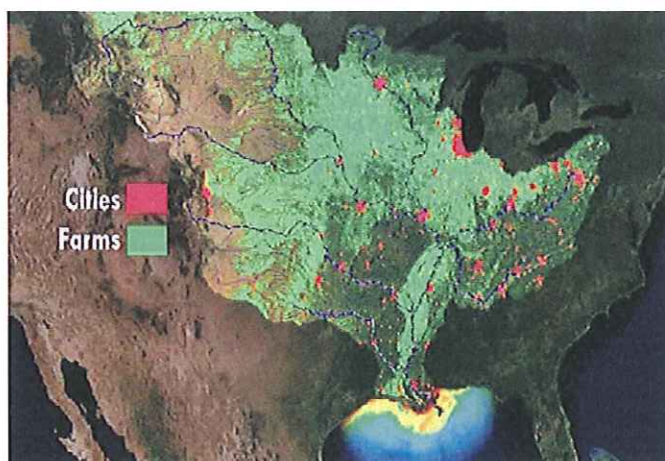

2. Regulatory Update KPDES Permit No. KYG200055

- A new Permit was proposed for release in June 2016
- Public comments were returned to regulatory officials
- Permit changes may include watershed monitoring and sampling
- There are no identified impaired waterways in Cold Spring
- Total Maximum Daily Load (TMDL)

DO NOT DISPOSE OF.

- Trash such as plastic, Styrofoam, aluminum cans, bottles, bags, 6-pack rings, fishing lures, etc., which are all LCAO (leaking and can injure or kill wildlife)
- Yard debris, dirt, rock, oil, grease, paint or chemicals which can plug the storm drains and prevent water to pass from functioning. This may reduce the effectiveness of the storm drain and result in localized flooding.
- Fertilizers and lawn clippings which provide a food source for algae and phytoplankton for algae and bacteria. This can further degrade our near shore waters and at times result in fish kills.

Help keep our water healthy and clean!

ILLCIT DISCHARGE
It is illegal to put anything but rain water down your drain or into water bodies, with the exception of discharges allowed under a NPDES permit or waters used for firefighting operations. Illicit discharges can result from illegal connections to the storm drain system from business or commercial establishments. Illicit connections may be intentional or may be unknown to the business owner and often are due to the construction of flow drains to the storm sewer system. Additional sources of illicit discharges can be failing septic systems, illegal dumping practices, and the improper disposal of sewage from recreational practices such as boating or camping.
