COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY COUNTY OF CAMPBELL CITY OF COLD SPRING ORDINANCE NO. 18- 1049

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CITY OF COLD SPRING'S CODE OF ORDINANCES RE: STREETS AND SIDEWALKS/EXCAVATIONS AND CONSTRUCTION

Whereas, the City of Cold Spring has established a Code of Ordinances, of which Title IX, General Regulations, Chapter 91, Streets and Sidewalks, Excavations and Construction governing the City of Cold Spring.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF COLD SPRING, COUNTY OF CAMPBELL, COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY:

Section I

The City of Cold Spring approves an amendment to the Code of Ordinances, Title IX, General Regulations, Chapter 91, Streets and Sidewalks, Excavations and Construction, Section §91.07 as follows:

§ 91.07 PERMIT REQUIRED WITHIN RIGHT-OF-WAY.

It shall be unlawful for any person or business to perform any work within the city's road right-of-way including, but not limited to cutting, excavating, or boring into the city right-of-way without first obtaining a permit from the city. Upon obtaining such a permit, said person or business shall strictly comply with the city's regulations and specifications as to performing work in the city road right-of-way. The permit shall be two part, the permit fee in the amount of \$100, and the posting of an indemnity/bond in the amount of \$2,500, to insure restoration of the City's right of way. The City's regulations shall be developed by the office of the Mayor and insure restoration of the City's right of way, including all infrastructure, as well as compliance with any stormwater or other regulations.

Section II

That any section, or part of any section, or any provision of this Ordinance which is declared invalid by a Court of appropriate jurisdiction, for any reason, such declaration shall not invalidate, or adversely affect, the remainder of this Ordinance.

Section III

This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force when passed, published, and recorded according to law.
