Describe your public education/outreach efforts during 2018:1.TAC meeting, September 13, 2018; 2.The City along with consultant Bayer Becker Inc.., maintains the city's website with public education and outreach information; 3. During 2018 Cold Spring expanded its website adding more stormwater information. Bayer Becker continues to review, revise, update stormwater documents and pages on the City of Cold Spring, website; 4. The city of Cold spring published two stormwater articles that were included in the City of Cold Spring newsletter that was mailed to each of the 6,370 (100%) residents, as well as business owners; 5. SWQMP fact sheets were reviewed but no revisions made; 6. The City of Cold Spring continued to utilize televised city council meetings, TAC/SWAC meetings, website, documents, stormwater hotline, fact sheets and newsletter articles during 2018.

Currently, Cold Spring is not aware of a specific problem pollutant or problem waterbody in the community. Cold Spring takes a comprehensive approach to educate the community related to water quality, including educational information about chemicals, use of herbicides/pesticides, water conservation, yard waste disposal, recycling of wastes and construction site erosion/management. The effort/focus is to educate the community at large all residents and businesses.

Each plan is specific to each site, with BMP's adopted specifically for each site.

Yes, all development over one acre, or even if under one acre, but originally part of a larger development, is reviewed by Bayer Becker, with a stormwater plan, including pre and post construction requirements.

At what frequency are inspections occurring at active construction sites? Please attach a copy of the Inspection Form used by the MS4.

Weekly and post storm inspection within 24 hours of rainfall more than ½ inch. With the Public Works Director becoming KESPC certified, he is developing an inspection form.

How many inspections in 2018 resulted in enforcement actions? Fines collected? There were no citations or fines issued, there were a couple of occasions, on one of the two permits issued for 2018, during which inspections found BMP's were not be followed and developer was told to stop work until remedied.

Describe any training given to operators/contractors in 2018? None, but as part of the two permits, the developers/engineers are in contact with City staff and/or Bayer Becker regarding compliance.

What is your budget for MCM #4? The stormwater program is operated within the revenue structure of approximately \$247,000 annually. The City is able to provide all permit compliance, along with mapping and other infrastructure. In addition to, the city is able to, while not part of the permit, also fund stormwater infrastructure, i.e. catch basins, etc.. In addition to, charges are issued to developers for permit review/inspection.

E. Post-construction Stormwater Management in New Development and Redevelopment:

Describe how the MS4 is implementing the post-construction stormwater management in new development or redevelopment requirements in your MS4; including the 80% stormwater treatment standard.

The City of Cold Spring in November 2018 adopted a new SWQMP which outlines actions to be taken including, but not limited to, review of subdivision regulations and BMP manuals. The specifics are set forth in 4.5 of the SWQMP adopted in November 2018. The city in 2019 will begin revisions to applicable ordinances and regulations consistent therewith.

MS4 staff must be trained in the fundamentals of long-term stormwater-quality treatment management practices and in how to review such practices on construction plans and how to inspect practices for long-term protection, operation and maintenance. Please describe the training of staff in 2018.

The public works department, Ron Hitch director and Derrick Kells, both have attended KESPC training and are certified. Also, Ron Hitch attended the quarterly meeting through KDOW and the city intends to continue sending its public works director. The KESPC training involved both how to review and inspect construction, but also to insure long term operation.

Is the MS4 requiring long-term maintenance agreements for new development and redevelopment projects? **Please attach a copy of the long-term maintenance agreement being implemented.** None adopted, yet, pursuant to the November 2018 SWQMP the city is intends to adopt a long term maintenances agreement documents for developments.

The Public Works directors created a monthly inspection program for all fuel and waste oil storage, all materiel bins are also checked for runoff. All equipment with a hydraulic or fuel tank is also checked to insure no leaks. All visible drains leaving building are also checked. All chemical spray is kept in a cabinet and no excess ever remains stored in spray equipment
