MESSAGE FROM THE MAYOR

With the completion of the new Police Department, Community Center, and Amphitheater I would like to provide an update regarding the city's finances. As you know, these projects were made possible by years of budget surplus all the while providing exceptional city services. The new Police Department is one of the best in the area, which our newer officers have expressed was a reason they chose to come to Cold Spring. In a time when police officer retention and recruitment is more difficult than ever, this type of benefit is more important than ever. The Community Center and Amphitheater was a vision brought to life to provide a gathering area to bring the city's residents together. While just opening, the response has been overwhelming.

Additionally, the Barth Lake Park is also complete. The new lake park was was completed at minimal cost to you through the generosity of a Cold Spring resident and the hard work of our Public Works department. The comments regarding Barth Lake Park have been daily, with surprise that there was no real financial cost to the city. While developers proposed filling in the lake, we instead turned it into a beautiful city amenity.

As investment in the Cold Spring Community has been robust, some have expressed concerns regarding the current financial position of the city. Cold Spring began the projects with a city surplus in excess of \$9 million. The construction costs were estimated to be between \$5-6 million. The city began the projects debt free and concludes the projects debt free. After paying for the projects in full, with only few remaining items to be provided, as of July 20, 2022, the City of Cold Spring has a current reserve of \$5.8 million.

Discussions were held regarding the council's desired reserve level and a potential loan. The city's auditor has always recommended a minimum of six (6) months operating expenses, or \$2 million in reserves. Currently the city has in excess of an entire year in reserve. The discussion regarding a loan was based on the level of reserves to be considered, nothing more.

The financial position of the city is quite simple. The city annually has operations summarized as follows, revenues less expenditures that result in excess of a \$200,000 per year surplus. The 2022-2023 fiscal year will be no different. The city's annual revenue is approximately \$4.2 million and the operating expenses will not exceed \$4 million. At the conclusion of the 2022-2023 fiscal year the city will have in excess of \$5 million in reserves, representing over a year of operating capital in reserves.

The Police Department, Community Center and Amphitheater are proud accomplishments for Cold Spring and its residents. These projects have not harmed the financial position of the city; reserves remain higher than suggested by the auditor. Most importantly, the projects are an investment in our community. Strong neighborhoods, vibrant business, safety, and public works are what make a community. Cold Spring checks every box. Property values are at an all-time high, people are constantly seeking to move to Cold Spring and there are few, if any homes for sale.

Lastly, all of this has been accomplished with one of, if not, the lowest tax rates in Northern Kentucky. Recently, council and I voted to lower property tax rates even further.

While some may complain about the city's projects and expenditures of money, I wanted to write and thank council and the residents. I am grateful for the opportunity to improve and provide a stronger community, where families gather with friends and neighbors and get to enjoy the fruits of their tax dollars.

I hope that I have answered any questions regarding the financial debt free position of Cold Spring. Council, again I want to thank you for sharing my vision for the City of Cold Spring. Your support has allowed the city to grow further and become a community others seek to emulate.
