The city continues with its road improvement projects with the rebuilding of Chapman Lane. Chapman Lane will be expanded and curb and gutter will be added; as well as phase one of the Darlas Drive project, which also adds curb and gutter to a majority of the roadway. Both projects are currently being scheduled with the city's contractors with anticipated completion by August of this year. Phase two of Darlas Drive is anticipated as being done next year as final planning is still being completed on that part of the project. These two roads once completed, will finish the original twenty-year road program for the city.

The city remains fiscally sound and we are currently debt free. There are several opportunities for development on the horizon for properties within the city and we look forward to bringing you news of those once we have the permission of the developers.

Once again I would like to thank you, and your elected council for both the support, and work that has been done, and is being done to keep the city moving forward. STORMWATER

Tree Canopy and Stormwater:

Did you know that trees and bushes impact not only the amount but also the quality of stormwater? The principals of stormwater management can be summarized as "slow stormwater down, spread it out, and soak it in." Trees and bushes help do all three! Here is how trees and bushes achieve this. First leaves catch and store rainfall, then release water back into the atmosphere. Second leaf litter helps build healthier soils that allow water to soak in and replenish our groundwater. Finally roots increase water infiltration and storage, which holds soil in place, and also helps to take up excess nutrients and other pollutants. Trees and bushes are also and important element for flood control. With Arbor Day just around the corner on April 28, 2023, consider planting a new bush or tree and help beautify your yard AND help with stormwater.

CODE ENFORCEMENT

There are many different ordinances that relate to maintaining our city in a neat and orderly condition. Some of the most common violations are listed below:

- Unlicensed and inoperable vehicles in a residential zone shall not be stored unless it is in a completely enclosed building.
- Parking in the yard is prohibited.
- Recreational vehicles, including campers, boats and trailers etc. shall be stored in the rear yard on a hard surface, or in a completely enclosed building.
- Unkempt and deteriorated buildings are not allowed.
- Debris, litter, rubbish salvage materials, motor vehicle tires, or miscellaneous refuse shall not be openly stored.
- Weeds and unmowed lawns are not acceptable.
- Temporary signs will not be allowed unless a permit is issued from the City Building.
- No person who is the owner of any animal shall permit it to run at large in any public road, highway, street, lane, or alley, or upon an enclosure without the consent of the owner of the yard, lot, or enclosure.
- It is unlawful for any owner, keeper or walker of any animal to permit his or her animal to discharge such animal's excrement upon any public or private property, other than the property of the owner of any such animal within the city if such owner, keeper, or walker does not immediately thereafter remove and clean up such animal's excrement from the public or private property

COMMUNITY CENTER

The community center has been getting plenty of use between rentals, open gym and events. We have been receiving great feedback about the center! The gym is currently open during the week from 8a.m. to 3:30p.m. as well as select Sundays for open gym. We post the open gym days and times on our website and Facebook page. The walking track is open daily from 8a.m. to 8p.m. unless posted that it is closed for a private event. One mile on the track is 18 laps.

Please keep in mind that persons under 18 must be accompanied by an adult at all times while in the community center.

LOOKING BACK

Cold Spring was originally known as "Rees Settlement." The area was named for one of the first families who came here from Virginia. David and Thomas Rees were listed in the very first tax lists before Campbell County existed. Thomas Rees was one of the original settlers at Leitch's station (near Wilder). When Campbell County was formed, they were listed as living on 3 Mile. In 1794 the Rees family helped some of the other early settlers form the Mouth of the Licking Church on the site of the present old Cold Spring Baptist Church (corner of Pooles creek and us 27). Daniel Boone received land in the area for his Revolutionary war service and when he sold the land in 1785, a natural cold water spring had been discovered. It is not known when the area began being referred to as Cold Spring, but reference was made in the Cross and Baptist Journal in 1835.

The John Rees family is buried in the old Cold Spring Baptist Church cemetery. The stones have fallen into despair, some stones are fallen over and broken. However, the inscriptions can still be read.
